## Paint it 'Green'

Cambridge highlights environmentally sound City Hall Annex with mural series

**C**ambridge's long-shuttered City Hall Annex will look a lot greener when it reopens next month. After a \$71 million restoration, the historic brick-and-brownstone building reopens in mid-January with an energy-efficient redesign and a large indoor mural series that simulates an interior garden courtyard.

Sweeping charcoal sketches splashed with pastel colors decorate the central atrium of the 19th century building that closed four years ago due to environmental problems.

Berkshires artist Mike Glier creates light, gestural sketches of people walking dogs, mowing lawns, rowing on the Charles and taking office coffee breaks. The figures are accompanied by naturalistic images of climbing ivy and blossoming roses.

The floor-to-ceiling mural series, "Town Green,"
